

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT
1984 – SECTION 14(1)(a)
THE A46 TRUNK ROAD AND THE
A45 TRUNK ROAD (TOLLBAR END)
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF
TRAFFIC) ORDER 2019**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited (Company No. 9346363) intends to make an Order on the A46 Trunk Road and the A45 Trunk Road, at Tollbar End in the City of Coventry and in the County of Warwickshire, to allow traffic management installation and removal for investigation and bridge repair works to be carried out.

The effect of the Order will be to close –

- a) the westbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the exit slip road leading to the roundabout junction with the A45, the A46, Siskin Drive and the B4110, at Tollbar End (Tollbar End Roundabout), to its junction with the A45; and
- b) the westbound carriageway of the A45 from its junction with the A46, to its junction with the entry slip road leading from Tollbar End Roundabout.

The closures to install/remove the traffic management to enable the investigation and bridge repair work to be undertaken, will be carried out between 00.01 hours and 06:00 hours. The installation work is expected to be carried out on Sunday 2 June 2019 and the removal works approximately 4 weeks later. It may be necessary for further closures to be carried out during the work period to install/remove any additional traffic management required. The Order will come into force on 27 May 2019.

Vehicles being used by police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes, and vehicles being used in connection with the works or for winter maintenance purposes will be exempt from the closure.

A diversion route via the westbound exit slip road and the westbound entry slip road at Tollbar End Roundabout will be signed.
