

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14(1)(a)  
THE A46 TRUNK ROAD (SHERBOURNE TO  
KENILWORTH, WARWICKSHIRE)  
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2021**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited (Company No. 9346363) intends to make an Order on the A46 Trunk Road, between Sherbourne and Kenilworth, in the County of Warwickshire, to allow maintenance works to be carried out.

The effect of the Order will be to close, at different times, –

- (1) the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the exit slip road leading to its roundabout junction with the A429, the M40 Junction 15 slip roads and Stratford Road (M40 Junction 15 Roundabout), to its roundabout junction with the B4463 and Stratford Road, at Sherbourne (Sherbourne Roundabout);
- (2) the northbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with Sherbourne Roundabout, to its junction with the entry slip road leading from the M40 Junction 15 Roundabout;
- (3) any slip road or link road leading to or from the southbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the entry slip road leading from its roundabout junction with the A452 Leamington Road at Kenilworth (Kenilworth Roundabout), to its roundabout junction with Sherbourne Roundabout;
- (4) any slip road or link road leading to or from the northbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with Sherbourne Roundabout, to its junction with the exit slip road leading to Kenilworth Roundabout;
- (5) the slip roads leading to and from the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A46, to and from Budbrooke Services, north of Sherbourne Roundabout;
- (6) any layby adjacent to the lengths of carriageway described in (3) and (4) above; and
- (7) the layby adjacent to the exit slip road leading from the southbound carriageway of the A46 to the M40 Junction 15 Roundabout.

The work will be carried out overnight, on week days only, between 21:00 hours and 06:00 hours and is expected to start on Monday 24 May 2021 and continue for approximately three weeks. The Order will come into force on 17 May 2021.

Vehicles being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance purposes and vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures.

Diversion routes via the M40 Junction 15 Roundabout and alternative junctions of the A46 will be signed.

THE A46 TRUNK ROAD (ANSTY TO BINLEY)  
(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC IN LAYBY)  
ORDER 2021**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited (Company No. 9346363) intends to make an order on the A46 Trunk Road, between Ansty and Binley, in the City of Coventry and the County of Warwickshire, to allow maintenance works to be carried out.

The effect of the Order will be to close –

- 1) the layby adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A46 approximately 1 kilometre north of the centrepoint of the roundabout junction with the B4082, near Binley; and
- 2) the layby adjacent to the southbound carriageway of the A46 approximately 1.7 kilometres south of the centreline of Central Boulevard underbridge, near Ansty.

The work is expected to be carried out between 21:00 hours on Friday 21 May 2021 and 06:00 hours on Saturday 22 May 2021. The Order will come into force on 14 May 2021.

Vehicles being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes, and vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures.
