**Development description:** Variation of conditions 24, 25, 27 & 30 of R20/1026 (Erection of 2 logistics units with associated works). Variation of conditions 24 - provision of site access & junction and 30 - use of construction

variation of conditions 24 - provision of site access & junction and 30 - use of construction access: to allow the construction access to be revised & used for operational access purposes for 12 months following first occupation of the first building.

Variation of condition 25 - reduction of speed

Variation of condition 25 - reduction of speed limit on Coventry Road: to require speed limit to be reduced within 12 months of the first occupation of the first building, rather than before first occupation.

Variation of condition 27 - provision of pedestrian/cycle route: to require the provision of the pedestrian/cycle route within 6 months of

technical highways approval.
