ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF D2351 SCHOOL HILL, OFFCHURCH

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing D2351 School Hill, Offchurch, between the junction of Village Street and the junction with Welsh Road, to vehicular traffic.

The closure is required for carriageway patching.

The Order will commence on 6 December 2016 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 7 December 2016.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: Welsh Road, Radford Road, Village Street (And in reverse order).

TEMPORARY 40MPH SPEED RESTRICTION FOSSEWAY, RADFORD SEMELE

Warwickshire County Council made a Temporary Traffic Order imposing speed restrictions on the Fosse Way, Radford Semele. Warwickshire County Council has now made a further Order restricting the speed of vehicular traffic TO 40mph in both directions, which will be indicated by appropriate signage, between Fosse Garage and the property known as Upper Blacon (situated 150 metres from the junction of The Fosse Way and Harbury Lane).

The restriction is required for the safety of all road users and of the contractors working on or near to the carriageway.

The Order will commence on 24 November 2016 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works to which it relates are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 26 February 2017.

As part of a highway improvement scheme, Warwickshire County Council hereby gives notice of its intention to signalise (1) the A46/Birmingham Road, Stanks Island roundabout; (2) the junction of A425 Birmingham Road/Wedgnock Lane; and (3) the junction of A425 Birmingham Road/Haywood Road in Warwick. All three schemes will include pedestrian and cycling facilities at certain locations.
