Church Street	From its junction with Vicarage Lane to its junction with Church Terrace	21 January 2019 to 15 February 2019	Church Street, The Bull Ring, Ivy Lane, South Parade, Vicarage Lane (and vice versa)

The closures are required to facilitate gas mains replacement works.

The Order will commence on 2 January 2019 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 15 February 2019.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.
