

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14

### TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CHAPEL STREET, BISHOPS ITCHINGTON

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing Chapel Street, Bishops Itchington, from a point outside no.24, to vehicular traffic. The closure is required for utility works.

The Order will commence on 16 October 2019 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 18 October 2019.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: Chapel Street, Lakin Drive, Gaydon Road and vice versa.

### TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PINEHAM AVENUE, HARBURY

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing Pineham Avenue, Harbury, from a point outside number 4, to vehicular traffic. The closure is required for the renewal of a water pipe.

The Order will commence on 14 October 2019 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 17 October 2019.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (A425 DAVENTRY ROAD, SOUTHAM) (50MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2019

Warwickshire County Council have made the above named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to remove the National Speed Limit and impose a 50mph speed limit on the lengths of road mentioned in the Schedule below. The Order commences on 30th September 2019.

A copy of the Order, together with the plans showing the lengths of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be inspected at the Main Reception, Shire Hall, Market Place, Warwick; at the Stratford on Avon District Council, Elizabeth House, Church St, Stratford-upon-Avon CV37 6HX; and at the Public Library, Southam Library & Information Centre, Tythe Place, High Street, Southam CV47 0HB, during usual opening hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### SCHEDULE

1. A425 Daventry Road – West side of Napton on the Hill  
690 metres from its junction with A423, in an easterly direction for 4050m up to the village sign for Napton on the Hill and the sign for the existing 30mph speed limit zone (on the west side of the village).
2. A425 Daventry Road – East side of Napton on the Hill  
507 metres from the Napton on Hill village sign and the sign for the existing 40mph speed limit zone (on the east side of the village) for 1430 metres in a north easterly direction to the village sign post for Lower Shuckburgh and the sign for the existing 40mph speed limit zone (on the west side of the village).
3. A425 Daventry Road – East side of Lower Shuckburgh  
From the Lower Shuckburgh village sign Post and the sign for the existing 40mph speed limit (on the east side of the village) an easterly direction for 4480 metres to Warwickshire County boundary sign.
