

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

Warwickshire County Council has made the following Temporary Traffic Orders:

### **FAIR CLOSE, MAIN STREET & BOURTON ROAD, FRANKTON**

**Order Effect:** Road closed to vehicular traffic between the junctions of Frankton lane, Blacksmith Lane and the track next to Newlands.

**Reason for Order:** Carriageway resurfacing and associated works, 08.00hrs-17.00hrs.

**Order Commences:** 19 November 2020 for up to 18 months.

**Anticipated Completion:** 24 November 2020.

**Access & Diversion:** Birdingbury Lane, Bourton Lane, Birdingbury Road, Main Street (Access to Bourton Road), Princethorpe Road, Frankton Lane (Access to Fair Close) and vice versa.

### **NORTH ROAD, RUGBY**

**Order Effect:** Road closed to vehicular traffic from a point opposite property number 39.

**Reason for Order:** To facilitate renewal of a boundary box and installation of a meter.

**Order Commences:** 17 November 2020 for up to 18 months.

**Anticipated Completion:** 19 November 2020.

**Access & Diversion:** North Road, Church Street, Main Street and vice versa.

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make the following Temporary Traffic Orders:

### **BACK LANE, RUGBY**

**Order Effect:** Road closed to vehicular traffic from its junction with Leamington Hastings Road.

**Reason for Order:** To facilitate works for a nonstandard domestic connection service.

**Order Commences:** 30 November 2020 for up to 18 months.

**Anticipated Completion:** 2 December 2020.

### **MURRAY ROAD, MILL ROAD AND RAILWAY TERRACE, RUGBY**

**Order Effect:** Roads closed to vehicular traffic from a point 50m south of Abbey Street on Murray Road to Post Office entrance north of the railway bridge on Mill Street.

**Reason for Order:** Carriageway resurfacing works, overnight Sundays/Mondays 20.00hrs-06.00hrs.

**Order Commences:** 29 November 2020 for up to 18 months.

**Access & Diversion:** For Murray Road and Mill Road, access to frontages will be maintained up to the closure points. No access through works area or under railway bridge.

Railway Terrace will be closed at the junction with Wood Street, with access to Rugby Railway Station being maintained at all time. There will be no access or egress for Rugby Station from Murray Road.

For all of the above temporary orders, pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

### **THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (NEWTON, RUGBY)**

#### **(30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2020**

Warwickshire County Council has made the above named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to impose a 30 mph speed limit on the lengths of road mentioned in the Schedule below. The Order commences on 19th November 2020.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### **SCHEDULE**

##### **1. Newton Road, Main Street, Newton Lane – 30mph (restricted road by virtue of street lighting)**

From a point in Newton Road 126 metres south of its junction with Pilgrims Lane, in a generally northwards direction to a point in Newton Lane 140 metres north of its junction with The Leys, a distance of approximately 690 metres.

##### **2. Newton Lane – 30mph speed limit (no street lighting)**

From a point in Newton Lane 140 metres north of its junction with The Leys, northwards for a distance of 200 metres.
