## NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 SECTION 257 AND PARAGRAPH 7 OF SCHEDULE 14

## THE WARWICK DISTRICT COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. W105 WARWICK) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2022

On 29th April 2022, Warwick District Council confirmed the Order for the above.

The effect of the Order, confirmed under Section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended), will divert that section of Public Footpath W105 from Point A (grid reference 429466-262920), as indicated on the Order Plan, running generally in a south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 842 metres to Point B (grid reference 429950-262428) AND there shall be a replacement path for that part of Public Footpath W105 From Point A, as indicated on the Order Plan, running generally in a south easterly direction to Point C (grid reference 429617-262826), then running generally in a southerly direction to Point D (grid reference 429920-262382) following the estate roads before joining the footpath at Point E (grid reference 429920-262382). The new footpath will have a width of 2 metres and will be approximately 883 metres in length from Point A to Point E.

The order shall come into force on the date on which Warwick District Council certify that the terms of Article 2 of the Order have been complied with but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within six weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 7 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
