ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ST. ASAPHS AVENUE, STUDLEY

Warwickshire County Council has made a Temporary Traffic Order closing St. Asaphs Avenue, Studley, from its junction with Corbizum Avenue to its junction with St. Judes Avenue, to vehicular traffic. The closure is required to facilitate utility works.

The Order will commence on 28 May 2019 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 31 May 2019.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible. An alternative route will be signed and is available via: St Asaphs Avenue, Corbizum Avenue, St Judes Avenue (and vice versa).

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 23 PROPOSED PUFFIN CROSSINGS

- 1) A435 Birmingham Road near Henley Road, Mappleborough Green, Studley
- 2) A4189 Henley Road near Birmingham Road, Mappleborough Green, Studley

Warwickshire County Council hereby gives notice of its intention to install two Puffin crossings:-

- 1) A435 Birmingham Road – approximately 60 metres north of the A4189 Henley Road, Mappleborough Green, Studley.
- 2) A4189 Henley Road – approximately 60 metres east of the A435 Birmingham Road in Mappleborough Green, Studley.
