ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF D3181 LITTLE CHURCH STREET, RUGBY

Warwickshire County Council has made a Temporary Traffic Order closing D3181 Little Church Street, Rugby at a point opposite the property number 12B, to vehicular traffic.

The closure is required to facilitate repair to a burst water main.

The Order will commence on 16 January 2016 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 17 January 2016.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF D3108 MILL ROAD, RUGBY

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing D3108 Mill Road, Rugby from the junction with Technology Drive to the junction with Railway Terrace, to vehicular traffic.

The closure is required to facilitate urgent street lighting refurbishment following temporary emergency repairs.

The Order will commence on 1 February 2016 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 5 February 2016.

Please Note: The works will be carried out between 09.30hrs and 15.30hrs daily.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: Murray Road, Clifton Road, Butlers Leap and vice versa.

(A428 CRICK ROAD RUGBY) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2016

Warwickshire County Council have made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which will be to impose a 40 mph speed limit on the length of road mentioned in Schedule 1 below and to revoke The Warwickshire County Council (A428 Crick Road, Hillmorton, Rugby) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 2008 and to revoke The Warwickshire County Council A428 Crick Road, Hillmorton, Rugby) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2012.

The Order commences on 18 January 2016.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan showing the length of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be inspected at the Main Reception, Shire Hall, Market Place, Warwick, at the Rugby Borough Council Town Hall, Evreux Way, Rugby, Warwickshire CV21 2RR, and at the Public Library, Rugby Little Elborow Street Rugby CV21 3BZ during usual opening hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from the date of making of the Order apply to the High Court for this purpose.
