

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF
PUBLIC PATH ORDER

THE BOROUGH OF RUGBY (PART OF
FOOTPATH R125 LONG LAWFORD)
PUBLIC PATH ORDER 2017**

On 15 March 2017 the Rugby Borough Council confirmed the above named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed will: -

Stop up part of Footpath R125 from A (Grid Reference 447395,275731) running in a south easterly direction for approximately 137 metres to Point N (Grid Reference 447466,275624) and create a new footpath commencing at Point A running in an easterly direction for approximately 13.5 metres to point B (Grid Reference 447407,275728) turning south and then south westerly for approximately 18 metres to point C (Grid Reference 447397,275712) then continuing south westerly for approximately 11 metres to point D (Grid Reference 447389,275707) curving southerly for approximately 7.5 metres to point E (Grid Reference 447384,275701) curving south easterly for approximately 7 metres to Point F (Grid Reference 447388,275694) continuing south easterly for approximately 17 metres to Point G (Grid Reference 447404,275687) continuing easterly for approximately 25 metres to Point H (Grid Reference 447428,275681) turning south easterly for approximately 11 metres to Point I (Grid Reference 447438,275676) continuing southerly for approximately 10 metres to Point J (Grid Reference 447443,275667) curving south easterly for approximately 13 metres to Point K (Grid Reference 447452,275658) then easterly for approximately 12 metres to Point L (Grid Reference 447465,275656) turning southerly for approximately 9 metres to Point M (Grid Reference 447467,275647) and finally continuing south for approximately 24 metres to Point N (Grid Reference 447466,275624)

A copy of the Order and the order map may be seen free of charge at the Town Hall, Evreux Way, Rugby from 9.00am to 5.00pm on weekdays. Copies of the Order and map may be purchased at the price of £5.00.

The Order comes into force on 23 March 2017 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained in it on the ground that is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under section 287 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by paragraph 8 of Schedule 14 to that Act.
