# THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (TUCKEYS CANAL BRIDGE, CATHIRON LANE, HARBOROUGH MAGNA) (10 TONNES WEIGHT RESTRICTION) ORDER 2018

Warwickshire County Council has made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to impose a 10 tonne maximum gross weight restriction on that length of Cathiron Lane, Harborough Magna which is carried by the bridge (known as Tuckeys Bridge) over the Oxford canal. The Order commences on Monday 16 April 2018.
