Warwickshire County Council has made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to vary the existing Warwickshire County Council (Borough of Rugby) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Waiting Restrictions, On-Street Parking Places and Residents' Parking) (Consolidation) Order 2017, as described (by approximate measurements) in the Schedule below. The Order commences on Monday 30 April 2018.

Exceptions to any waiting restrictions described in the Schedule below will permit waiting for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge and in connection with the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, water or electricity. A copy of the Order, together with a copy of an Order to be varied, plans showing the lengths of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected at the Main Reception, Shire Hall, Market Place, Warwick, at Rugby Borough Council, Town Hall, Rugby and at the Public Library, Little Elborow Street, Rugby during usual opening hours.
