ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF COALPIT LANE, WOLSTON

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Order closing Coalpit Lane, Wolston to vehicular traffic. The closure is required to facilitate utility works.

The Order will commence on 20 May 2019 and will last for a period of 18 months, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier. However, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 22 May 2019.

Pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: Coalpit Lane, Fosse Way, London Road, A45 J B4455 roundabout, Rugby Road, Princethorpe Road, Straight Mile, Blue Boar Flyover (and vice versa).

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH R250 IN THE PARISHES OF WILLOUGHBY & WOLFHAMCOTE

Warwickshire County Council made a Temporary Traffic Order closing Public Footpath R250 in the Parishes of Willoughby & Wolfhamcote to all traffic.

The closure was required to avoid the likelihood of danger to the public because of the dilapidated and dangerous condition of a bridge along its route.

The Order commenced on 10 November 2018 and was due to expire 9 May 2019. However, the Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under Section 15(5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has directed that the Order should continue in force until 10 May 2021 or until remedial works are completed, whichever is the earlier (unless the Secretary of State issues a further direction).

Access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of footpath to be closed will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: Moor Lane, Willoughby Road and Wolfhamcote Lane.

THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (MOORS LANE, RUGBY) (30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2019

Warwickshire County Council propose to make the above named Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to impose a 30 mph speed limit on the length of road described in the Schedule below.
