Warwickshire County Council propose to make the above named Orders under the road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be;

To restrict waiting as described in the Schedule 1 below;
To impose a 20 mph zone on the length of roads mentioned in the Schedule 2 below;

Warwickshire County Council also proposes under Section 90A and 90G of the Highways Act 1980 to install the road humps described in detail in the Schedule 3 below. Marwickshir South Count Council also propose under Section 65 and 66 of the Highways Act 1980 to convert the existing footway on Long Furlong road and Anderson Avenue, and Kingsway Road into a shared use footway/cycle track, on the lengths of Road and as described in more detail in the Schedule 4.

THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (LINK ROAD NORTH, RUGBY) (30 & 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2019 AND THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (LINK ROAD NORTH, RUGBY) (PROHIBITION OF RIGHT AND LEFT TURNS) ORDER 2019

Warwickshire County Council has made the above Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to:-

1. impose a 30 mph speed limit on the lengths of road described in Schedule 1 below; 2. impose a 50 mph speed limit on the lengths of road described in Schedule 2 below; and

3. to prohibit right and left hand turning movements at the junction of the Link Road North with Hillmorton Lane as described in Schedule 3 below.

SCHEDULE 1 (30 mph Speed Limit)

Link Road North From a point which commences in line with the back of footway of the south eastern side of Clifton Road, extending in a generally south-easterly direction along Link Road North for a distance of 489 metres.

SCHEDULE 2 (50 mph Sp ed Limit)

Link Road North

From a point which commences 489 metres south-east from the back of footway on the south eastern side of Clifton Road, extending in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of 1.904 metres.

SCHEDULE 3

(Turning Movement Bans) No Left/Right turn bans

1. Link Road North -(i) From Link Road North, travelling in a north westerly direction, no right turn at the Hillmorton Lane junction, into Hillmorton Lane.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CATHIRON LANE, HARBOROUGH MAGNA

Warwickshire County Council has made a Temporary Traffic Order closing Cathiron Lane, Harborough Magna from its junction with Easenhall Road and for a distance of approximately 130 metres in a southerly direction, to vehicular traffic. The closure is required to facilitate repairs to a water pipe.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF C193 MAIN STREET/SAWBRIDGE ROAD, GRANDBOROUGH
