Application for reserved matters approval of access, appearance, landscape, layout and scale, for the construction of 84 no. dwellings at Parcel C of Key Phase 2, of the Houlton development (R17/0022), including tertiary streets and bellmouth junctions, internal vehicular, pedestrian and cycle access, residents and visitors parking (including garages), external footpath connections, hard and soft landscaping, lighting, boundary treatments, bin storage and collection points, any necessary drainage and utilities works, groundworks, any necessary demolition, temporary stockpiling of materials, construction compounds, areas for construction use, and temporary haul routes for construction purposes.
