Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange Order 202X Tritax Symmetry (Hinckley) Ltd (TSH) is commencing the statuto consultation on proposals for the Hinckley National Rail Freig tatutory Freight Interchange (HNRFI)

Interchange (HNRF1). HNRFI is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) and includes alterations to Junction 2 of the M69 motorway to provide south-facing slip roads and a new highway linking Junction 2 of the M69 motorway with the B4668 Leicester Road. As an NSIP the proposals are determined at a national level by the Government, rather than being determined by the local planning authority. TSH will apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Secretary of State for Transport Transport.

The rail freight interchange is located on land to the north-east of Hinckley, south of Elmesthorpe, east of the Leicester to Hinckley railway and west of the M69 motorway. The main features of the proposed Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange are:

- · New rail infrastructure providing access to the series of parallel sidings
 - sidings
 Intermodal freight terminal ('railport') capable of accommodating up to 16 trains per day of up to 775m in length
 Hard surface areas for container storage
 Up to 850,000m2 GIA of warehousing and ancillary buildings with a total footprint of 650,000m2 and up to 200,000m2 of mezzanine

 - floorspace
 - Lorry park with HGV fuel filling station
 - Energy services area incorporating an electricity sub-sta connected to the local distribution network and a gas-fired heat power plant (10MW generation capacity fed from solar PV inclus standby capacity (20MW) and battery (20MW) Terrain remodelling, hard and soft landscape works, amenity w Energy sub-station and including
 - works, amenity water and planting atures

 - Noise attenuation measures acoustic barriers up to 6m in height Pedestrian, equestrian and cycle access routes and infrastructure A new link road from M69 junction 2 to the B4668 / A47 Leicester Road including:
 - New access r oad connecting to an internal road network serving the SRFI

 - SRF1 New rail bridge within the SRFI site New junction at B4668 / A47 Leicester Road Works to the M69 motorway at Junction 2 comprising: Reconfiguration of existing roundabout and approach lanes Reconfiguration of existing rou-Additional southern slip roads

A DCO is the statutory process for obtaining planning permission for a NSIP. The application is Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development and TSH will submit an Environmental Statement with the Application.

The formal statutory consultation stage on HNRFI will run from 12th January 2022 to 9th March 2022.

The deadline for responses to the consultation is 9th March 2022.
