

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 -SECTIONS 14(1)(b) AND 15(2) THE A452 AND A446 TRUNK ROADS (NEAR LITTLE PACKINGTON) (TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2020

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited (Company no. 9346363) intends to make an Order on the A452 and A446 Trunk Roads, in the Metropolitan Borough of Solihull and the County of Warwickshire, due to a likelihood of danger to the public whilst a temporary works access/egress is being used.

The effect of the Order will be to -

- (1) impose a 50 miles per hour speed restriction on a) the northbound carriageway of
  - a) the northbound carriageway of the A452 from a point 800 metres northwest of its roundabout junction with the slip roads leading to and from the A45 (Stonebridge Roundabout), to its junction with the A446;
    - its junction with the A446;
      b) the northbound carriageway of
      the A446 from its junction with the
      A452, to a point 100 metres north of
      the centreline of the A452 Chester
    - Road overbridge; c) the southbound carriageway of the A446 from a point 760 metres south of its junction with the slip road leading to the roundabout junction of the A452, the B4438 and Solihull Parkway, to its junction with the A452; and
    - the southbound carriageway of the A452 from its junction with the A446, to the centreline of its junction with Packington Lane.

The speed limit will be in operation 24 hours a day from 00:01 hours on Thursday 16 January 2020 and continue until the temporary access/egress is removed. The Order will come into force on Monday 13th January 2020.

Vehicles being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance and special forces purposes will be exempt from the
