make a prescribed alteration, by expanding Reynalds Cross Special School on to a split school site from 1 September 2021. This expansion will create 12 additional places in the first year, with a further 8 additional places (a total of 20 places) by

September 2022.

Working in partnership with the school, the Council has developed a proposal that will increase the number of places available at the school through the use of a 'hub' based in the Coronation Youth Centre building, Green Lane, Shirley, Solihull, B90 1AE. The building will be remodelled to provide an environment appropriate to the needs of the pupils. Reynalds Cross School already operates its early years provision at Green Lane Nursery, in the building attached to Coronation Youth

searly years provision at Green Lane Nursery, in the building attached to Coronation Youth Centre. This proposal will allow the school to use the whole building and create a wider offer for children with Special Educational needs who require specialist provision. This specific development would be aimed at older pupils, in the 14-19 age range, whose needs can be met in this bespoke provision. This notice is an extract from the complete proposal document.
