Wilmcote and Pathlow Neighbourhood Development Plan Referendum

The Wilmcote and Pathlow Neighbourhood Plan was independently examined in July this year and the Examiner recommended that, subject to some proposed modifications, the Plan should proceed to referendum.

The District Council agrees with the Examiner's report and Members voted to progress the Plan to referendum at a meeting of The Cabinet on 9 October this year. The referendum will be asking whether the community wish to see the District Council use the Neighbourhood Plan to decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area (which is based on the Parish boundary).

In accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning (Referendum) Regulations 2012 (as amended) the Local Planning Authority must publicise the referendum for a minimum of 28 working days prior to the date of the referendum.

The referendum for the Wilmcote and Pathlow Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 30 November 2017. The polling station will be the Wilmcote Village Hall, Glebe Estate, Wilmcote CV37 9XL

A number of documents (referred to as 'specified documents' in the Regulations) have been produced in order to help you make a decision on how to vote.
