## Claverdon Neighbourhood Development Plan Referendum

The Claverdon Neighbourhood Plan was independently examined between March and May this year and the Examiner recommended that, subject to some proposed modifications, the Plan should proceed to referendum.

The District Council agrees with the Examiner's report and the Portfolio Holder for

'Place' at the District Council has endorsed the recommendation to proceed to referendum. The referendum will be asking whether the community wish to see the District Council use the Neighbourhood Plan to decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area (which is based on the Parish boundary).

In accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning (Referendum) Regulations 2012 (as amended) the Local Planning Authority must publicise the referendum for a minimum of 28 working days prior to the date of the referendum.

The referendum for the Claverdon Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 24 October 2019. The polling station will be the Claverdon Church Centre, Church Road, Claverdon CV35 8PD.

A number of documents (referred to as 'specified documents' in the Regulations) have been produced in order to help you make a decision on how to vote. These specified documents can be viewed on the District Council's website at www. stratford.gov.uk/claverdonnp. Alternatively, printed versions of the specified documents may be inspected at Stratford-on-Avon District Council's offices, Elizabeth House, Church Street, Stratford-upon-Avon and Henley-in-Arden libraries during normal opening hours.
